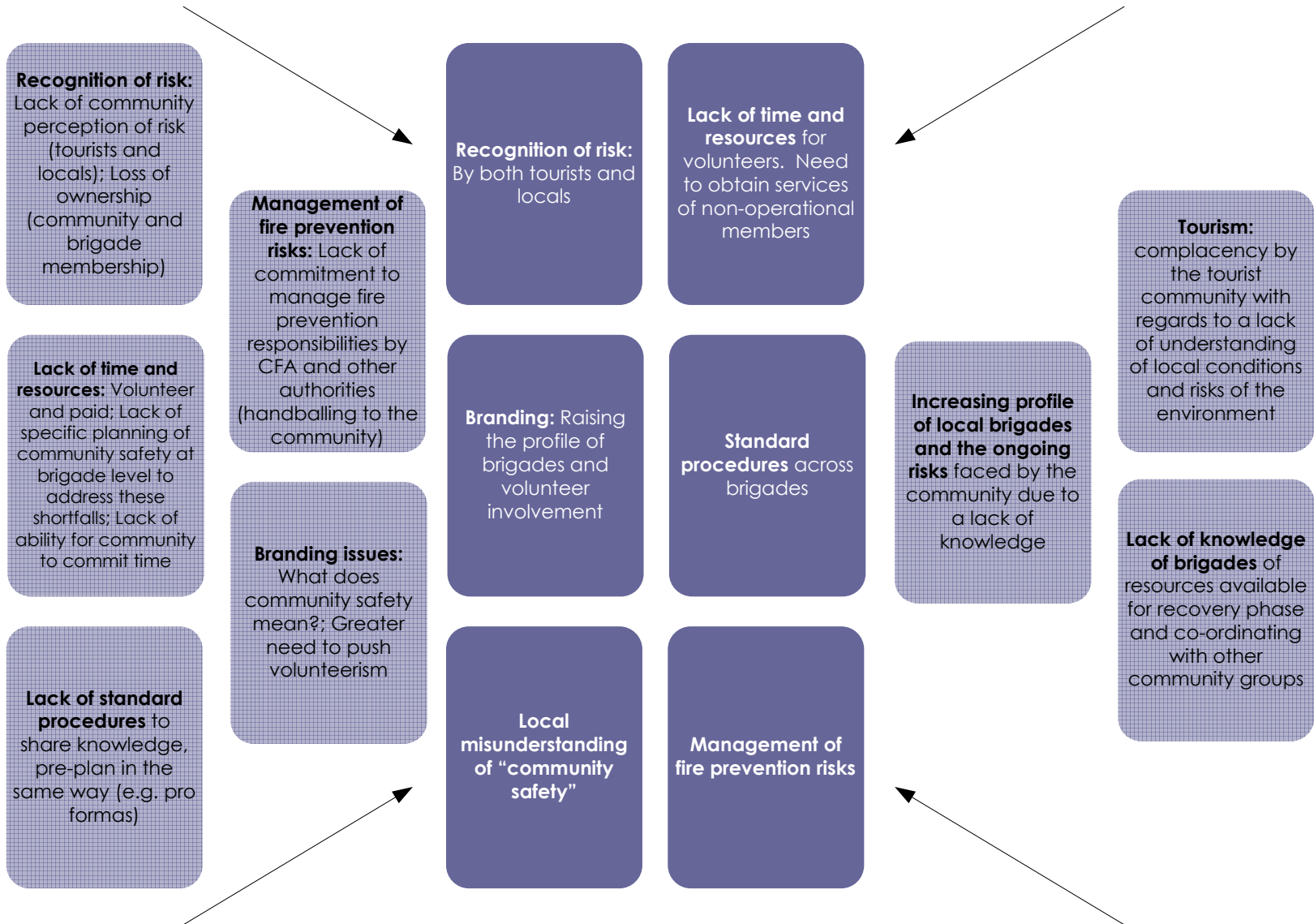
Community Safety Framework 2025

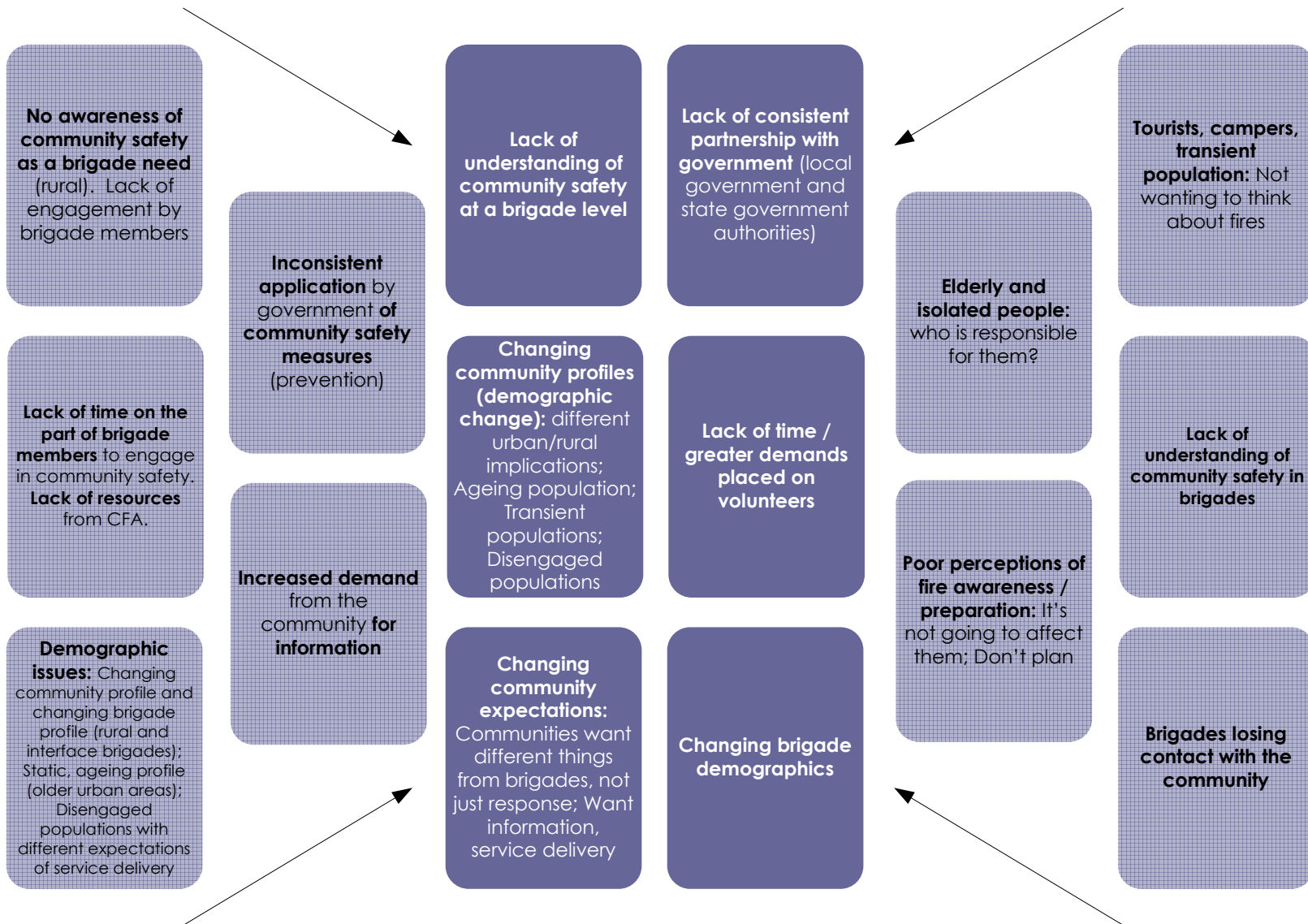

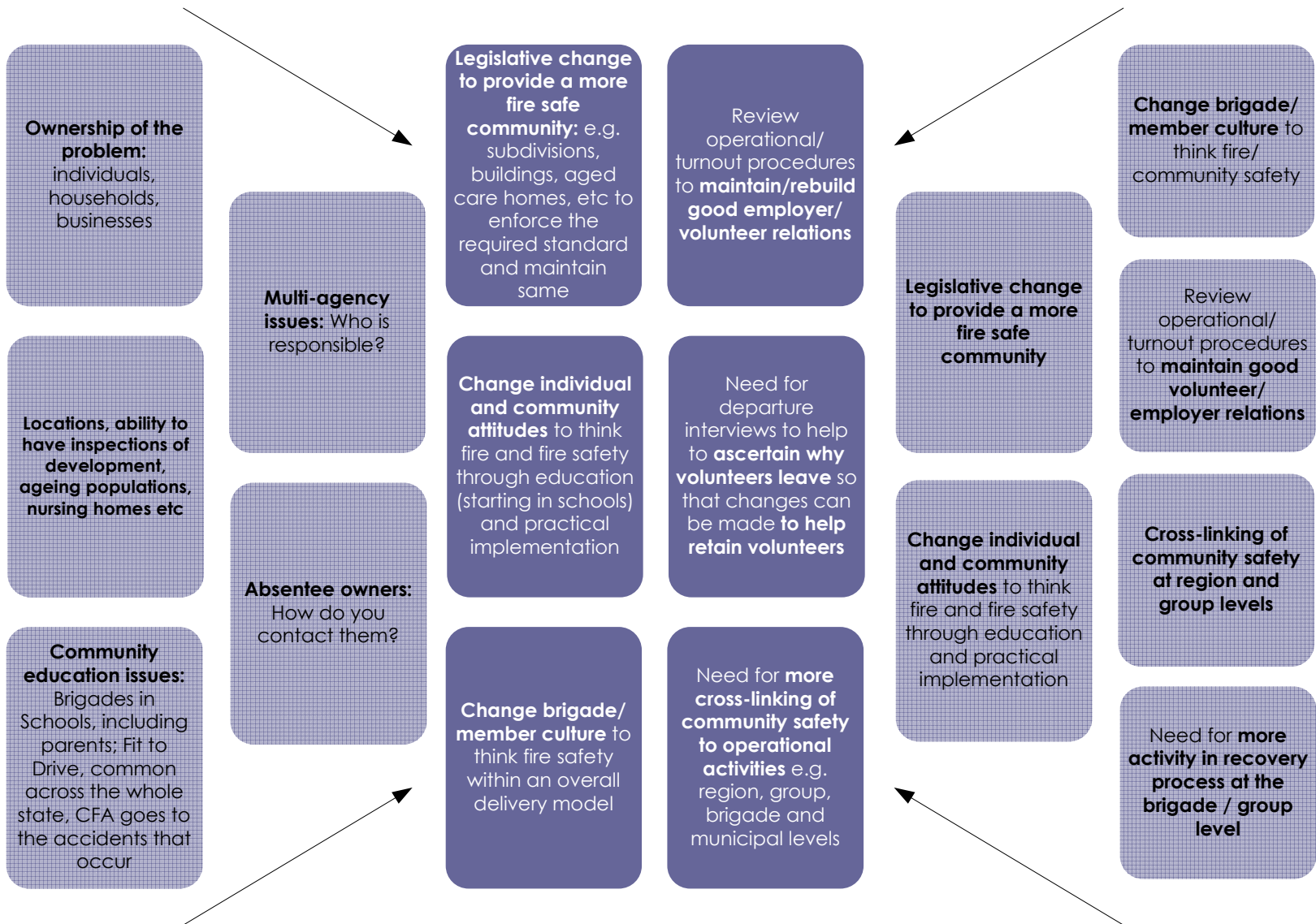
