Assistant Chief Officer

As part of the move to a new regional model, CFA is seeking to appoint five Assistant Chief Officers. This opportunity is advertised as of today both internally and externally. The ACO will lead the delivery of fire and emergency management services in each newly established region spanning: planning, prevention, preparedness, response and operational recovery. Each ACO will actively develop strategies, budgets and business plans and manage the resources of the region, whilst providing regular advice and support to the Chief Officer. Successful applicants will have demonstrated senior management experience and visible leadership qualities that empower staff and volunteers to carry out statutory obligations across the region. They will also have strong strategy, technical and operational understanding, coupled with the ability to foster relationships within the community. Experience in emergency services management and qualifications in a relevant discipline are a pre-requisite. Emergency+ App

The "Emergency+" app for smartphones was developed and built by the national Triple Zero Awareness Working Group (TZAWG). The working group found that these problems arose largely because more than 66 per cent of incoming calls to Triple Zero are now made from mobile phones. Mobile callers often do not know exactly where they are, therefore tying up call-takers and preventing them from processing the next incoming call. Without an accurate location, it is difficult to dispatch resources and often their arrival on the scene is delayed. The Emergency+ app enables Triple Zero (000) callers to tell Emergency Services calltakers their location co-ordinates, using their smartphones' existing GPS functionality. The app is free to download.

<u>Change your Clocks – Change your Smoke Alarms Campaign</u>

Australia's fire and emergency services attended more than 12,000 residential fires in 2013. Last year within the CFA area there were 1,897 residential fires, resulting in 8 deaths and an estimated \$61 million damage. The campaign to encourage Victorians to change their smoke alarm batteries when they change their clocks is one way of raising awareness regarding the number of house fires and encouraging people to take preventative action at the end of daylight savings on Sunday 6 April. Smoke alarms provide an essential early warning and time to evacuate safely – but only if they work. Some of the key messages for this year's Campaign include:

- Only working smoke alarms save lives.
- Change your smoke alarm batteries when you change your clocks on Sunday 6 April.
- Victoria's fire services recommend long-lasting alkaline batteries for smoke alarms.
