The next weeks will be significant for a number of long serving CFA employees who have chosen to leave CFA to start the next phase of their life.

Regional Directors Don Kelly and Alan Davies both have their last day with CFA on the 4 July. Don has had nearly 43 years service, starting as a volunteer at Woodend in November 1971. Key appointments include as a District Officer at Ballarat and Melton Regional Offices, then as Area/Regional Manager/Director of North West Metro, Wimmera and now Grampians Region. Alan commenced with CFA as a reserve at Dandenong in May 1968 and leaves with 46 years of service. In 1975 Alan joined the CFA staff as a Regional Officer and he has served in a variety of field locations. Since 1995, Alan has been the Area/Regional Manager/Director of the North East / Hume Region. Over the coming weeks, we also see a number of very experienced Operations Managers (O/M) and Operations Officers leave the service through retirement.

O/M Gerry Verdoorn at District 7 in Geelong, retires (but he will keep on running) after 46 years service. He started as a volunteer at Linton and served at a number of locations including in Districts 2, 13 and 7.

O/M Barry Foss, the Foss family has a proud tradition in CFA. Barry started as a Junior Volunteer at North Geelong in 1968, joining the staff as a career firefighter in 1974 and serving at a number of locations including Ballarat City, Geelong City and Norlane. He has been a District Officer at Portland and Corio, Operations Officer in District 7 and is currently the Operations Manager embedded into the Protective Equipment Section at North Geelong.

O/M Tony Bearzatto, Tony joined Eltham CFA as a volunteer in 1981 and has served at Boronia, Dandenong and Springvale stations. He has been an Operations Officer and Acting O/M in District 13 and is currently the O/M Manager CAD Operations.

Victorian Emergency Management Training Centre

The new Victorian Emergency Management Training Centre, situated at 284 Hume Hwy, Craigieburn will be officially opened on Sunday, 29 June at 10am.
